Principal's Soapbox

21ST NOVEMBER - TEACHER ONLY DAY

We're counting down the final weeks of the term! We have a busy schedule ahead, full of exciting Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) events and various sporting activities.

We are especially excited to share the fantastic results from our recently completed Progressive Achievement Tests (PATs). Our students performed exceptionally well, especially considering these assessments are now aligned with the new curriculum, which has higher expectations for achievement.

Here is a snapshot of our success:

- Reading Comprehension: 78% of our children are achieving at or above the expected level in the New Zealand Curriculum.
- Mathematics: 85% of our children are achieving at or above the expected level in the New Zealand Curriculum.
- Writing (Years 5-8): Our students achieved results all above the national mean! This is a tremendous result, as this was the first time our students have completed this specific new assessment.

These results are a powerful testament to the hard work of our students and teachers in adapting to the new curriculum standards. Congratulations to everyone on these amazing achievements!

Introduction

Welcome to Every Day Matters. This is a termly report that highlights attendance patterns in your school and provides actionable insights to improve student attendance.

Four Student Attendance Categories have been developed to help schools understand how frequently each student attends. These categories give you a way to monitor the progress you are making in supporting students to attend regularly.

Student Categories	Student with	Equivalent to
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term
Irregular absence	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term
Moderate absence	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term
Chronic absence	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term

This report provides a snapshot of how your school is performing, including an overview of the reasons for absence broken down by justified and unjustified reasons, insightful trends and next steps.

In April 2024, the Government announced a regular attendance target of 80 percent of students to be present for more than 90% of the term by 2030.

NOTE: In some cases, results have been rounded to the nearest percentage point to simplify the presentation of results. As a result, some totals may not add up to 100%.





In Term 3 of Year 2025, Other ethnic group had the highest proportion of students with chronic absence, with 67% of students at school less than 70% of the time.


Absence

A 'Justified Absence' is an absence defined within a school's policy as an acceptable reason for a student to be away from school.

An 'Unjustified Absence' is recorded when a student is away from school and:

- There is no information or there is a throw-away excuse
- Explained but not within school policy, such as absence due to birthdays
- Absence due to holiday in term-time
- Extracurricular activities not organised by schools like sports, dance, music, or hobbies.


What differences are there between year levels in reasons given for absence?



Year 4 students had the highest proportion of justified absences, with 73% of their absences being for justified reasons. Year 2 students had the highest proportion of unjustified absences, with 37% of their absences being for unjustified reasons.

Pacific students had the highest proportion of justified absences, with 73% of their absences being for justified reasons. Other students had the highest proportion of unjustified absences, with 51% of their absences being for unjustified reasons.
